Sub: Representation to reconsider and withdraw the Collegium recommendation in relation to the transfer of Hon'ble Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma from Delhi High Court to High Court at Calcutta.

My Lord,

We, the elected representatives of the three wings of the Bar in the High Court Calcutta are constrained to write to you to convey the concerns of all our members in respect of the Collegium recommendation dated 27<sup>th</sup> March 2025 in relation to the transfer of Hon'ble Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma from Delhi High Court to High Court at Calcutta.

While we are conscious of regular transfers in usual course of administration of justice, we have reasons to believe that this transfer does not fall in that category. We also have reasons to believe that this transfer is due to certain allegations that came to light touching the propriety and manner of functioning of the Learned Judge.

We are very much aware of the serious complaints against the Hon'ble Judge since October 2024 during his tenure at Delhi High Court and we understand that your Lordship's office has also been apprised of the same. The details and the particulars available in such complaints are not only disconcerting, but also extremely disturbing and we feel we do not need to go into the nitty gritty as the details are available in the office of My Lord. Copies of email dated 28<sup>th</sup> October, 2024 and 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2024, as available on various social media sites are enclosed herewith.

Considering the facts and circumstances we feel that, the principle "*Justice should not only be done but seen to have been done*" be considered by receiving the decision of the collegium.

Being the oldest Constitutional Temple of the Country the High Court at Calcutta conceivably does not deserve to have a transferred Judge with, either questionable image or a short stint. Our High Court has previously experienced short stints of various transferred judges who were though sent for "better administration of justice" but in effect became a dumping ground in the past. We can cite the instances of Justice Rakesh Tiwari (transferred on March 2016 and superannuated on Oct 2017), Justice V. M. Velumani (transferred on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and superannuated on April 2024), Justice Rajeev Sharma (transferred on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2015 and superannuated on September 2017), Justice M. V. Murlidharan (transferred on November 2023 and superannuated on April 2024) and Justice Surya Prakash Kesharvani (transferred in November 2023 and retired in July

2024). Such short tenures prior to retirement does not and cannot have any significant impact in the discharge of judicial functions and did not "better" the administration of justice. There performance record in the High Court may please be called for from the High Court Administration, which will support our contention. To top it all the High Court at Calcutta had to countenance the chaotic situation resulting from the acts and deeds of Justice C. S Karnan which is well documented.

Past bitter experience of having transferred Judges mentioned as above and their performance, do not install confidence rather acts adverse to the interest of the institution. Instead we beseech your Lordship to kindly transfer back some of our Judges who are now working in various other High Courts.

We, therefore under the given distressing scenario humbly beseech Your Lordship and the Collegium to review reconsider and withdraw the Collegium decision dated 27<sup>th</sup> March 2025 pertaining to transfer of Hon'ble Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma from Delhi High Court to High Court at Calcutta.



**Subject: Alarming conduct of Justice D.K Sharma.**

Respected Chief Justice,

I extend my heartiest congratulations on being confirmed as the Chief Justice of the Delhi High Court. It burdens my heart to write to you in this manner, however serious concerns have arisen regarding the integrity of some judges of the Delhi High Court, which need your urgent attention, as the Aam Aadmi's perception and belief in the judicial system is suffering due to the actions of a select few.

At this point in time, I am compelled to share shocking details that have come to light about the conduct and action of Justice D.K Sharma. Previously, Justice D.K Sharma was handling original side civil matters, however the assignment was recently changed with effect from 04.07.2024 and now Justice Sharma is given the charge of criminal matters.

You will be shocked to know that Justice Sharma has marked approx. **40-45 matters** from the original civil side as being '**part heard**'. A list of some of the matters of note which are marked as part heard by Justice Sharma is annexed.

The liberty to keep some matters partly heard is exercised by Judges when they have spent considerable time listening to the matter in the ordinary course and when they expect to dispose off the matter within a hearing or two, but may not be able to do so on account of a foreseeable change in the roster. But Justice Sharma has been seen to mark matters as 'part heard' in utmost haste, sometimes on the very first day or hurriedly within few hearings of the listing before him.

Usually the assignments are expected to change at the beginning of the new year and after summer vacations. In anticipation of such a change, it is of special note that His Lordship has given this special status of 'part heard' to matters in anticipation of such a change in assignment – either towards the end of the year or just before vacation period.

These actions show that His Lordship is acting deliberately to keep the matter with himself even after the roster has changed. No judge ever marks a fresh matter as part heard on the day when he issues notice. It is equally unheard of for a judge to mark a matter as part heard on the very first day when it comes up before him, when one side has only commenced arguments. What is even more shocking are instances where even pleadings are not complete, but the matter is marked part heard by Justice Sharma!!!

As a result of the zealous approach of Justice Sharma towards these special part heard matters, most of his time is consumed in taking up these matters of these original side even though he has been assigned the criminal roster. Justice Sharma often takes up these part heard matters before the lunch hour, sometimes immediately after lunch and on some occasions at 3pm till he rises for the day. Effectively, Justice Sharma has been holding court for original side matters even though he no longer holds that roster. The façade of being heard is actually camouflaging the fact that the outcome of these matters is pre-determined, tracing its roots back to the day when it was first marked as part heard.

A perusal of the list attached demonstrates that the matters kept as part heard are all high stake matters, pertaining to well-known and renowned players. Interestingly, out of the 40-45 matters carried forward, some matters were released whereas some were categorically retained before Justice Sharma where the outcome is all but an open secret. It seems that the keenness to decide a case well beyond the change of assignment has a direct relationship with who the parties are and how deep their pockets go. These actions of Justice Sharma do not inspire confidence in his ability to dispose off these matters independently or uninfluenced by external factors.

This practise of marking such a large volume of high stake matters as "part heard" is unique and likely exclusive to Justice Sharma, which may be verified independently by your goodself through your own channels and appropriate enquiry may be initiated.

The disclosed circumstances raise serious questions about the integrity of the judicial process, the preservation of which is paramount, as justice should only be done but seen to be done especially in matters of such significant financial implications involving public institutions. At this critical juncture in the journey of our Country, where all eyes including those of the international community are looking to us to set an example of integrity and justices, it is incumbent upon us to stand tall on the values we claim to espouse.

The identity of the undersigned cannot be revealed for obvious reasons, however given the seriousness of the underlying facts, it is hoped that you will treat this complaint with the seriousness it deserves.
